


# The AYJ Fund smíles ... cures

The AYJ Fund was created in honor of Anna Yan Ji Arabia, who was diagnosed at age 13 with gliomatosis cerebri (GC), a rare brain tumor. At the time of Anna's diagnosis, there was no research being done on this type of cancer. We are committed to supporting new research now being conducted to find effective treatments and a cure for this devastating disease.

#### IN THE FIGHT OF HER LIFE

Throughout the past ten years, we have connected with hundreds of children with cancer and their families. We have heard exciting results of stable MRI

scans and have helped fund End-of-Treatment celebrations. We have also experienced, along with many parents, the devastation of being told their strong and



beautiful child has a diagnosis of cancer. Throughout this time, we have met the most courageous, kind, brilliant and fun children and young adults who bring us joy by meeting and getting to know them.

One of these very special people we feel blessed to have connected with is Carrigan Nelson. We met Carrigan at the Strong Little Souls Gala in Pittsfield in May. Carrigan had received an AYJ Fund SMILES pack, and we were excited to meet in person. Although



Carrigan has had five long years of treatment for osteosarcoma, including radiation, chemotherapy and multiple surgeries, including an above-the-knee amputation, the tumors in both lungs are now growing again. Carrigan has no

further local treatments available, and has been approved for a clinical trial using a new CAR T-cell therapy. Carrigan faced additional heartbreak when

her insurance was not accepted by the hospital. She was told she needed to pay out-of-pocket \$54,000 for the trial, plus the costs of the hospital admission, travel and additional expenses. Her care was delayed, but luckily after a difficult process they accepted her insurance and she will be starting the trial. The remainder of expenses are still her responsibility. Our AYJ Fund is happy to provide some support. In spite of previous lung surgeries, and now active tumors in both lungs, Carrigan continues to sing with her most beautiful voice, and spread joy and love wherever she goes.

Kota has been fighting leukemia since July 2021. After




long periods of time in the hospital, he was feeling better and his Mom wanted to surprise him and his siblings with a getaway to their favorite indoor water park.

# **Spring Smiles**


Each year, we celebrate

# AYJ FUND's 10th ANNIVERSARY CELEBRATION



We celebrated the end of our 10<sup>th</sup> year of the AYJ Fund supporting children with cancer. It was a very special evening as we gathered to thank all who have made this possible. We were amazed when we calculated that we have distributed 4,662 AYJ SMILES to children, and


thrilled to announce the total raised over ten years was over \$1.86 million, with \$1.39 million directed to funding brain cancer research to find effective treatments for these children who face such devastating diagnoses.


